Facts You Should Know

Research shows that social support has real benefits for women with breast cancer including reducing anxiety, psychological distress, depression, and feelings of pain, as well as improving mood, self-image, ability to cope and feelings of control.

Emotional support is very important for those touched by a diagnosis of breast cancer. Supportive services can help breast cancer survivors and their family members through difficult times. Seeking help outside of your normal support system can be very beneficial.

Facing a major illness can change the dynamics of an existing support system. It is important to remember that a breast cancer diagnosis affects more than just the patient. Family, spouses, partners, friends and loved ones are also affected and may need supportive services.

Support groups can be a tremendous source of comfort, but they don't suit everyone. For those who prefer to share feelings one-on-one, individual counseling may be for you.
